## About the webinar

The event began with the insights of Mr. Prashant Manchanda about his professional journey in cybercrime. He addressed the attendees about what's right and what's wrong in cybercrime and shared his father's advice regarding the crime "One should first find the remedy of the crime in law."

He told the students about what cybercrime is and how to deal with it. And he further discussed the law that is the National Security Act made in 2008 and its implementation in 2009. He shared his experience of the cases related to cyber-crimes and also aware that what should be things one should do in case of being a cyber- crime victim.

In his session, he also stressed about 5 dimensions of war including the importance cyber war and stated how young minds could help to curb cyber-crimes if they would be unanimous. He also shared an anecdote of APJ Abdul Kalam that once it was asked to Mr. APJ Abdul Kalam that where he sees India in the next few years. He politely answered that a country would grow when the youth of the country would study.

Ultimately the session concluded with Mr. Prashant Manchanda, answering the queries of students on important skills required to curb cyber-crimes.
