

A. REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

All the admissions are done as per the University of Delhi Admission

Rules.

- For admission in Undergraduate Courses of their choice, a candidate must appear in Common University Entrance Test (CUET).
- Applicants with gap year(s) are also eligible to appear in CUET and will not be at any disadvantage for the purpose of admission to undergraduate courses.
- Only marks scored in CUET will be the basis of admission in the courses and colleges selected by the candidate. The eligibility score will be declared by the University.

B. GUIDELINES FOR CUET-BASED ADMISSION

- The applicants are requested to refer to the University of Delhi Admission Guidelines & Bulletin of Information 2022-2023 issued by the University at <https://admission.uod.ac.in>
- The process of DU admissions for the academic session 2022-23 is as under:

- **Physical documents to be checked by the College after admission:**

Given below is the *list of important documents that candidates need to produce at the college for admission*. It may be noted that candidates need to carry both the original and photocopies of the documents mentioned below.

S. No.	Documents to be produced at the time of Admission
1.	3 Passport-size photographs
2.	Class X certificate/ mark-sheet indicating date of birth and parents' names
3.	Class XII mark-sheet
4.	PwD/KM/Minority Certificate issued by a competent authority

Note: According to the official website of Delhi University: "The names of applicants claiming reservation under PwD/KM/Minorities must match with the names that appear on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates; similarly, their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates."

- In case, a student cancels his/her admission in the College, in order to move to another college on declaration of subsequent cut-off lists or needs certificates, submitted to the College, for institutes outside Delhi University, the College shall promptly give the documents to the candidate.
- Every admission is provisional and subject to confirmation by the University of Delhi.
- No student will be allowed to take admission in two courses/colleges simultaneously. In case, a candidate is found admitted in two course/colleges simultaneously, the admission in all course/colleges will be cancelled.

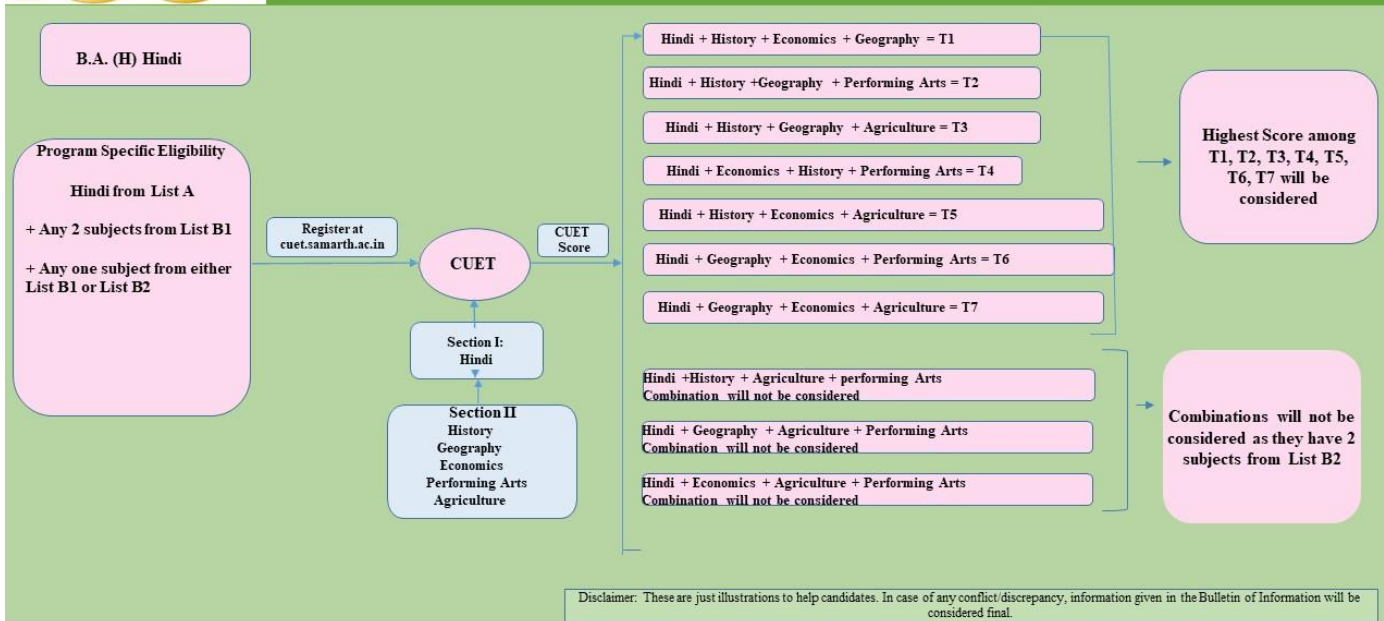
Illustrative Example for Admission to B.A. (H) English

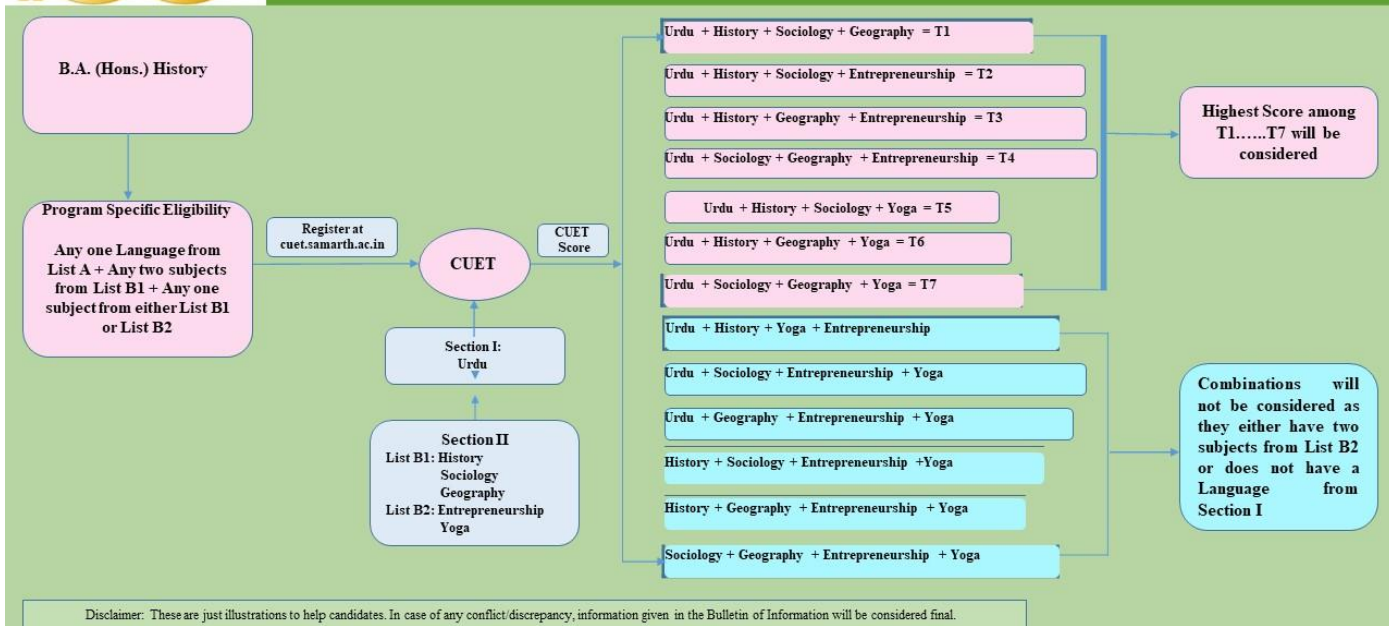
Illustrative Example for Admission to B.A. (H) Hindi

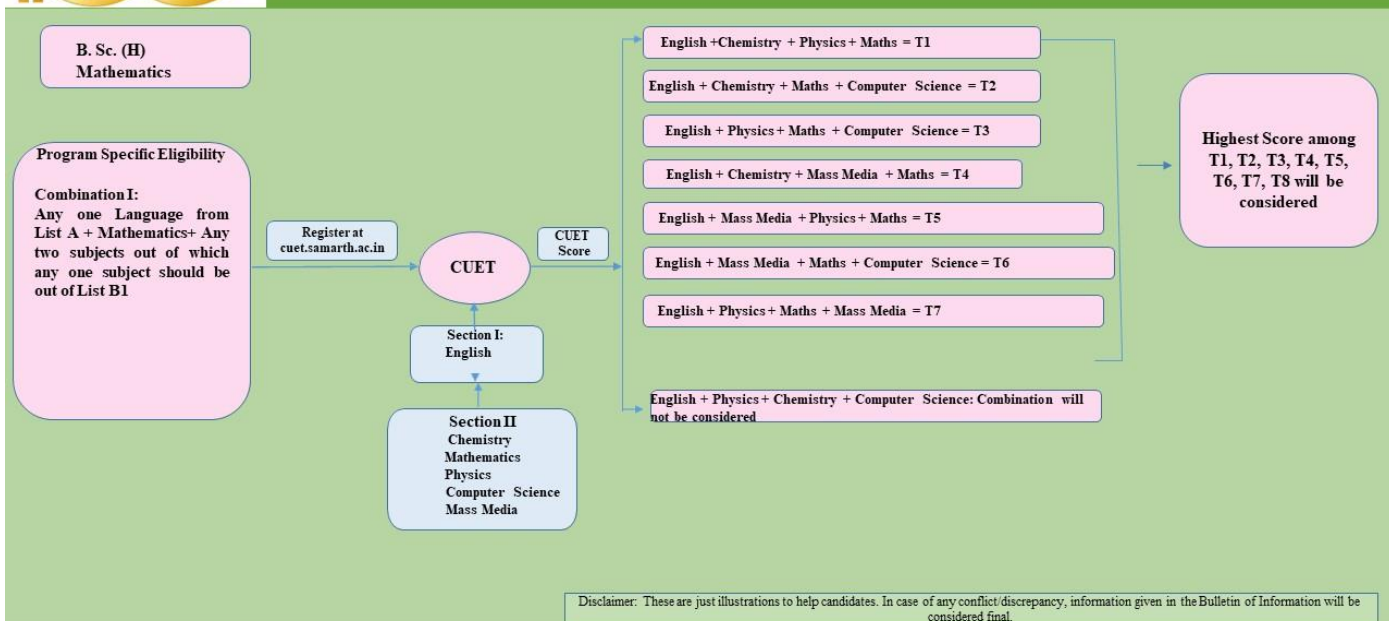
Illustrative Example for Admission to B.A. (Hons.) History

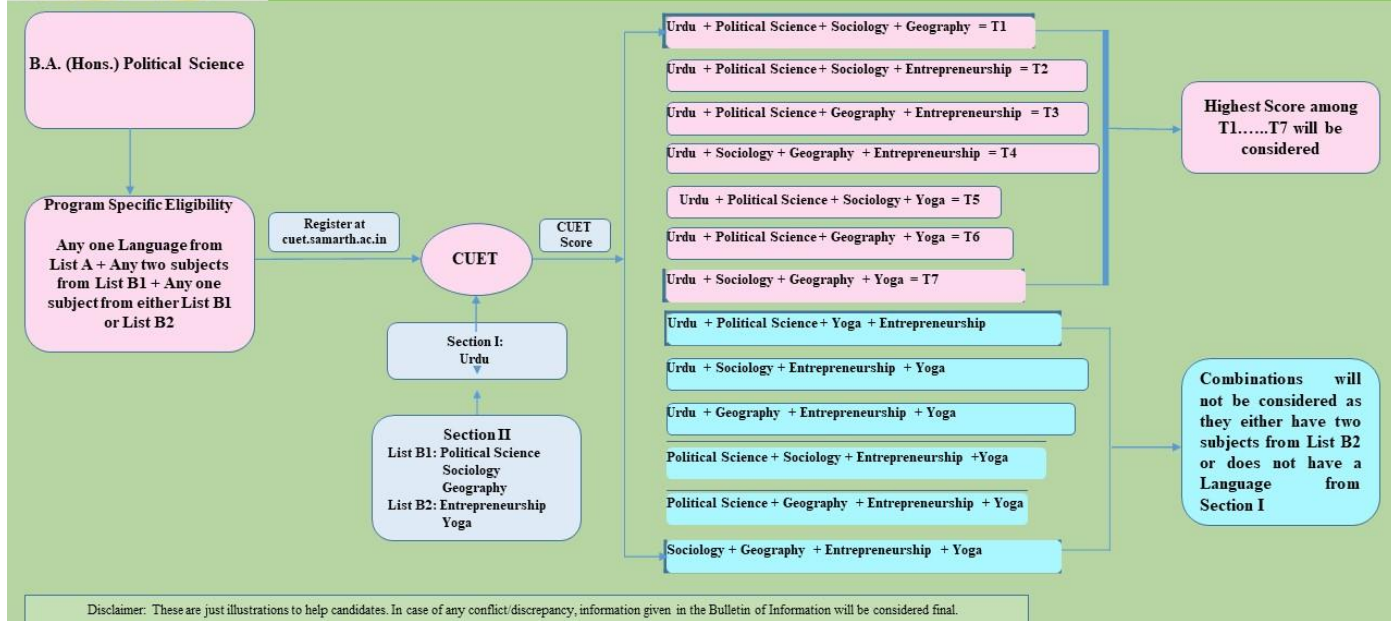
Illustrative Example for Admission to B. Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics

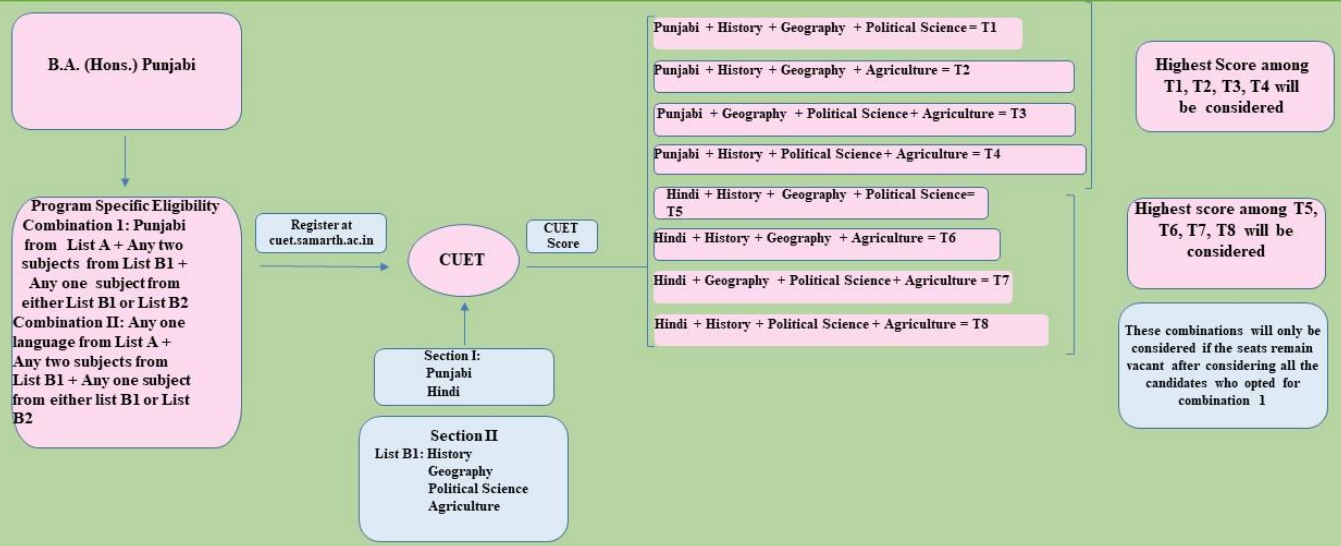


Illustrative Example for Admission to B.A. (Hons.) Political Science

Illustrative Example for Admission to B.A. (Hons.) Punjabi

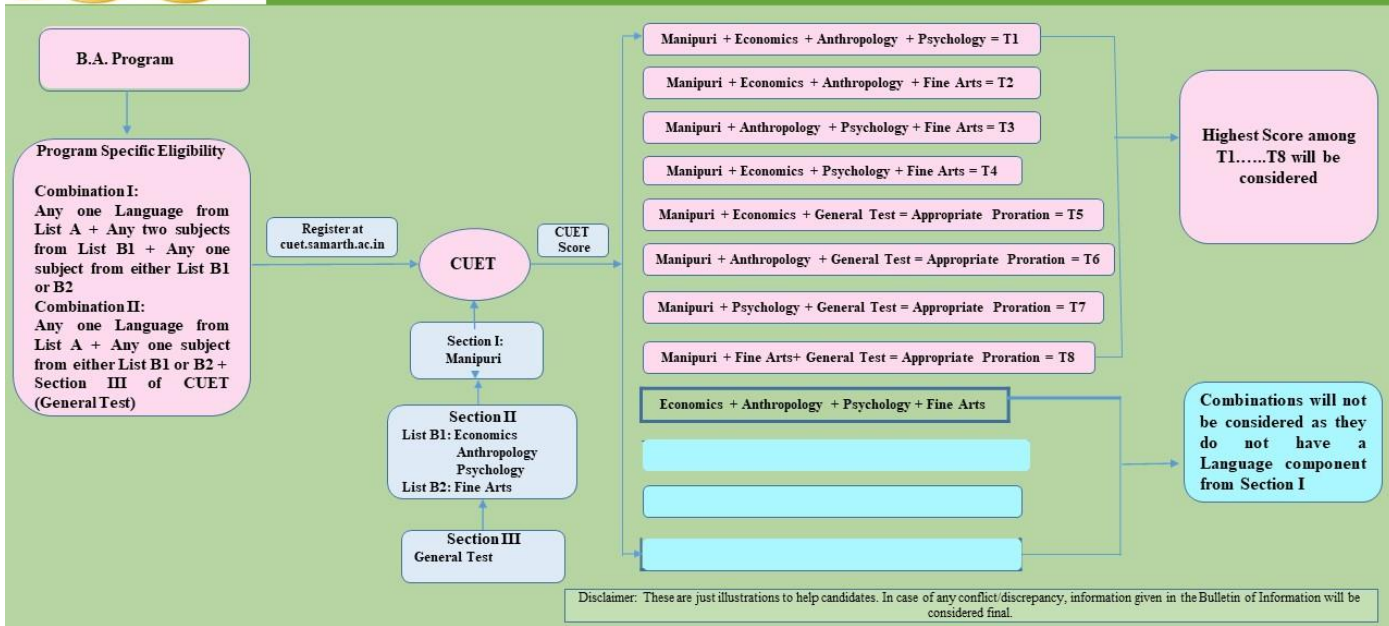

Illustrative Example for Admission to B.A. Program

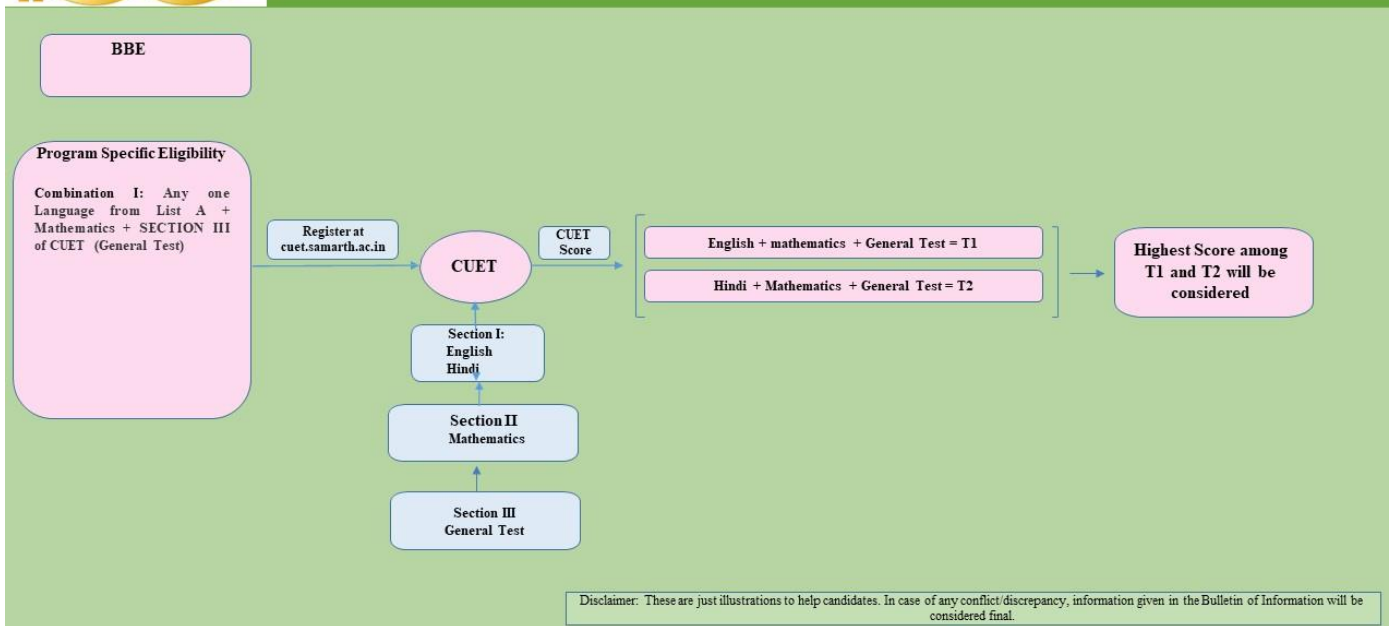

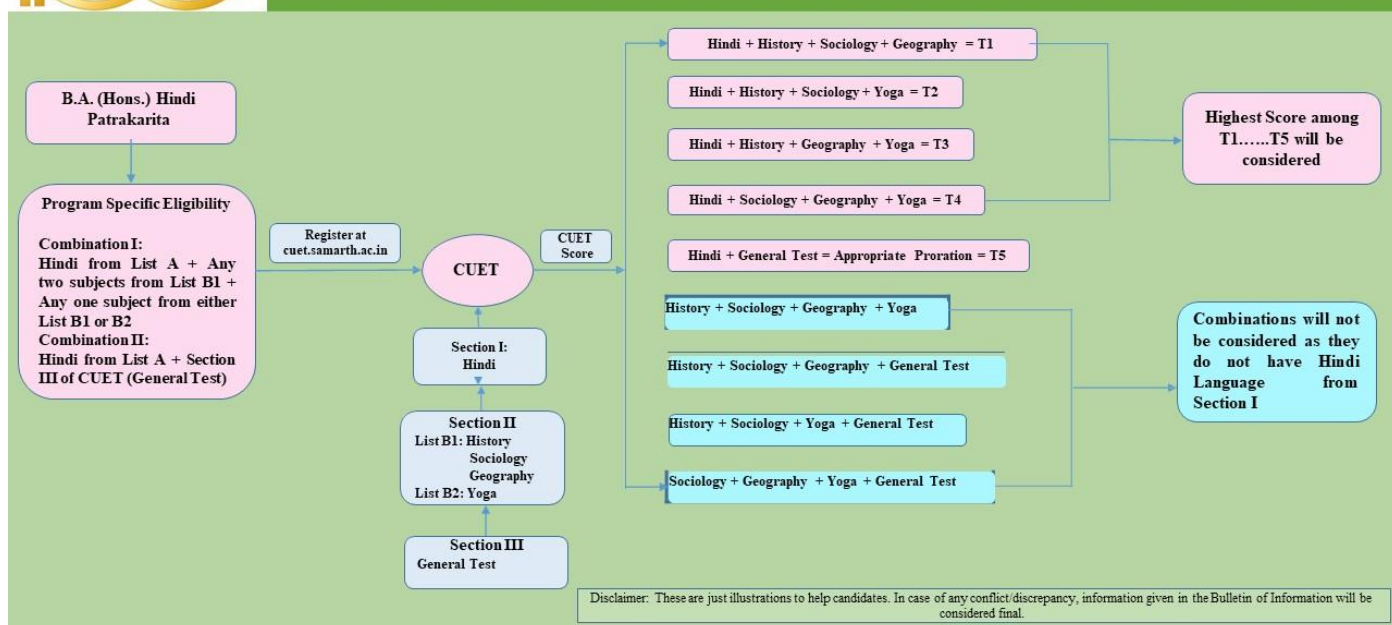
Illustrative Example for Admission to BBE
